



Family Camp Kit List

This has been adapted from the standard list for Cubs and Scouts and is only a guide.

All personal items should ideally be clearly labelled.

Tent (unless you have asked us to provide one for you)
Camp chairs – we have picnic tables but chairs are better!
Lantern or torch – we have a number of lanterns but you might want one for your tent.

Clothing

Uniform (those with a uniform should travel to and from the camp in their uniform)
Warm sweater, jumper or sweatshirt (One or more!)
Long sleeved shirts
T-shirt or similar
Trousers or shorts (**NO** jeans please as these provide very little warmth if damp or wet.)
Spare underclothes
Spare socks
Nightwear; pyjamas, woolly hat (lots of heat is lost from the head), socks and old jumper
Hike boots or strong shoes
Training shoes
Wellingtons (the grass may well be wet from dew or rain and wet feet can be very unpleasant)
Waterproof coat or jacket (essentially plastic of some sort as this should be able to give good protection from hours of rain or drizzle)
Wool hat, scarf and gloves or
Sun hat, sun cream and sun glasses

Clean clothing should be packed in plastic bags as an extra precaution against the rain also you don't want wet and dirty stuff packed with the clean. It is best to pack a rucksack or other bag that you can carry on your back. Suitcases may not be suitable for use in tents.

Sleeping

Sleeping bag (in the spring or autumn extra thickness and warmth can be got from blankets or old duvet)
Pillow
Sleeping mat

Eating

Tea towel (we have sets of plates, mugs and cutlery, enough for everyone but if you have your own favourites do bring them.)

Washing etc

Towel(s) (there are showers available to everyone.)
Torch and spare batteries
Personal first aid kit
Personal washing requirements – soap, flannel, toothpaste, toothbrush, etc
Comb and hairbrush
Hankies

Medication (if needed)

Wet weather - *Thought should be given to the likely weather conditions at this time of year. We must be prepared for any and all of them! We can keep the cubs and scouts well fed and occupied but if they get their clothing wet they will get cold as we do not have any way of drying out wet clothing at camp. In the extreme we will have to go home early!*
